Dear Parents

Following on from the Prime Minister's announcement on Monday evening regarding the continuation of current COVID restrictions until Monday 19 July, we have thoroughly reviewed all the events and activities we have in our calendar from Monday 21 June until the end of term.

With coronavirus cases linked to the new Delta variant significantly on the rise, we are conscious of the need to follow all government advice and guidance and for us to continue to maintain the safest possible environment in school for all our pupils and staff. One of our main considerations and restrictions lies within social distancing, particularly with bringing large numbers of parents and visitors onto the school site.

Many of our planned events, as you will be aware, were realistically only going to be possible with restrictions lifted. Below I have summarised the major additional calendar events and their status – which will either be:

- a. Going ahead as per calendar with COVID safety measures in place
- b. Reorganised under a new format and/or date to meet COVID safety measures
- c. Postponed or rearranged due to our inability to run the event successfully due to current COVID restrictions
- d. Still to be confirmed
