Topic/s: Fractions, Decimals, Percentages; Multiplication and Division; Perimeter and Area; Statistics. Aim/s: To multiply numbers up to four digits by a 1- or 2-digit number using a formal written method, including long multiplication for 2-digit numbers. To divide up to four digits by a 1-digit number using the formal written method of short division and interpret remainders appropriately for the context. To multiply proper fractions and mixed numbers by whole numbers, supported by materials and diagrams. To read, write, order and compare numbers with up to 3 decimal places. To read and write decimal numbers as fractions. To solve problems involving numbers up to 3 decimal places. To round decimals with 2 decimal places to the nearest whole number and to 1 decimal place. To recognise the per cent symbol (%) and understand that per cent relates to "number of parts per 100", and write percentages as a fraction with denominator 100, and as a decimal fraction. To measure and calculate the perimeter of composite rectilinear shapes in centimetres and metres. To solve comparison, sum and difference problems using information presented in a line graph To complete, read and interpret information in tables, including timetables. Skills: Through their learning pupils will develop the skills of: Calculation; 4 rules of number; conversions; place value; problem solving; mental strategies; formal written strategies; reasoning.
