To be able to identify some artefacts in church and know some things about the work of the priest. To recall a few features from the celebration of Mass and identify parts of stories of Jesus that show him helping other people. To know that Lent is a special time of prayer and a time to try to help others. To know about some of the events of Holy Week and be able to talk about what Jesus did on Palm Sunday, The Last Supper and Good Friday. To know that Easter is the celebration of the Resurrection of Jesus. Skills: <i>Through their learning pupils will develop the skills of:</i> Recognition & interpretation of symbolism, sequencing skills, listening, singing, role-play, thinking skills, writing prayers. 	 Topic/s: RSHE Religious Understanding introduces children to the story of creation, where God created the earth, sea, stars, plants, animals and humans. Me, My Body, My Health Children will learn about their uniqueness in real terms, including celebrating differences and individual gifts, talents and abilities. Emotional Well-Being Children will learn about likes, dislikes and self-acceptance. They will learn from Freddy Teddy and his friends how to describe different feelings, both good and bad, that actions have consequences and that when we make mistakes, we should say sorry and ask for forgiveness. Life Cycles children will explore the natural human cycle of life, focusing on what children can remember about their development so far and what they know will happen as they get older. This is underpinned by the religious understanding that growing up is part of God's plan for our lives and that we are loved by Him at every life stage.
