

<p>Mathematics</p> <p>Topic/s: Halving, doubling and sharing; grouping; spatial reasoning; counting patterns beyond 10; adding more; taking away; even and odd.</p> <p>Aim/s:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> To count reliably with numbers from 1 to 10, place them in order and say which number is one more or one less than a given number. To subitise (recognise quantities without counting) up to 5. To automatically recall number bonds to 5 (including subtraction facts) and some number bonds to 10, including double facts. To count beyond 20, recognising the pattern of the counting system. To compare quantities up to 10 in different contexts, recognising when one quantity is greater than, less than or the same as the other quantity. To explore and represent patterns within numbers to 10, including evens and odds, double facts and how quantities can be distributed equally. To talk about size, weight, capacity, position, distance, time and money to compare quantities, objects and shapes. <p>Skills: Through their learning pupils will develop the skills of: Counting numbers; calculating simple addition and subtraction problems; problem-solving; describing shape, space and measure.</p> <p>Subject teacher/s: Mrs O'Carroll-Bailey - Mrs Allen</p>	<p>Literacy</p> <p>Topic/s: <i>Let's take a trip.</i> Exploring different ways to travel around the world, in space and under the sea.</p> <p>Aim/s:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> To read words containing digraphs, trigraphs and consonant blends from Phases 2, 3 and 4. To read and understand simple sentences, using phonic knowledge to decode and recall common irregular words. To demonstrate understanding when talking with others about what has been read. To anticipate key events in stories. To use and understand recently introduced vocabulary during discussions about stories, non-fiction, rhymes and poems during role play. To use phonic knowledge to write words in ways which match their spoken sounds, as well as some irregular common words. To write simple sentences which can be read by themselves and others. Some words will be spelt correctly and others will be phonetically plausible. To correctly form lower-case letters. To make comments about what they have heard and ask questions to clarify their understanding. To hold a conversation when engaged in back-and-forth exchanges with their teachers and peers. To participate in small group, class and 1:1 discussion offering their own ideas and introduced vocabulary. To offer explanations for why things may happen.
