9 Garden Decoration Ideas from Reused or Recycled Items

1. Tin Can Wind Chimes

- Materials: Empty tin cans, string or wire, paint, beads, old cutlery or keys
- **Instructions**: Decorate the cans with bright paint, then hang them at different lengths using string. Add beads or small metal items to clink together and create gentle sounds in the breeze.

2. Bottle Cap Flowers

- Materials: Plastic or metal bottle caps, sticks or wooden dowels, glue, paint
- **Instructions**: Glue bottle caps into a flower shape, paint them brightly, and attach them to sticks to "plant" in the garden beds.

3. Plastic Bottle Bird Feeder

- Materials: Plastic bottle, wooden spoons or sticks, string
- **Instructions**: Cut holes in the sides of the bottle to insert the spoons (for perches and seed access), fill with bird seed, and hang from a tree.

4. CD or DVD Garden Mosaic

- Materials: Old CDs/DVDs, cardboard or wooden base, glue, scissors
- **Instructions**: Cut CDs into small shapes and glue them onto a shape (like a butterfly or flower) to make a reflective, mosaic-style decoration.

5. Milk Carton Planter Creatures

- Materials: Empty milk or juice cartons, paint, googly eyes, string
- **Instructions**: Cut and decorate cartons as animals or funny faces, fill with soil and flowers or herbs, and display them around the garden.

6. Spoon Plant Markers
