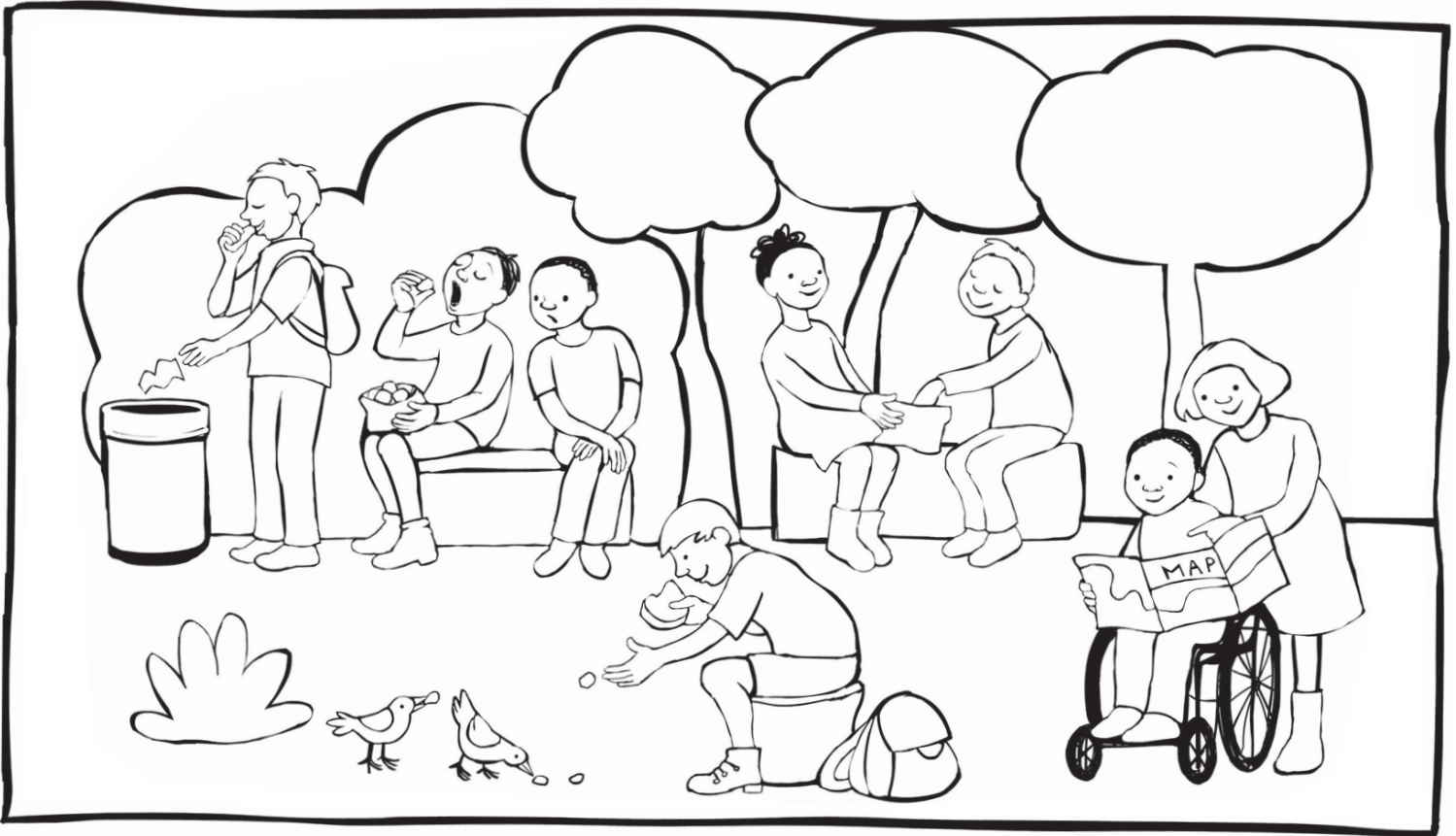


# Fourth Sunday of Lent (Year A)
