Costumes for the Summer Production

Your child will be performing in the Summer Production and will require at least one costume. We would be very grateful if you would provide costumes as shown below. Please bring these items into school by Monday 10 June in a named carrier bag and ask your child to hand it to their class teacher.

A Hint of Snow White

Please avoid hats/headpieces unless specified as these can cause issues with movement and microphones.

All children should wear school shoes unless otherwise stated.

Malodorous - Long/calf-length black, purple or dark blue dress, a cloak and a gothic-style crown embellished with 'jewels'. Must match with the other Malodorous. Small dark coloured purse/bag to wear crossbody (can have 1 and share when swap).

Lickspittle – Black jeans, a plain purple top and gold waist coat. Short black cape.

GobbleGook – Black jeans, a plain purple top and gold waist coat. Short black cape.

Announcer – Gothic dress or black jeans/leggings and a plain purple t-shirt. Dark denim/leather jacket and shades.

Pimple – Black jeans/leggings, a plain dark blue top and gold waist coat. Ox/bull horns.

Globby – Black jeans/leggings, a plain green top and gold waist coat. Green goblin hat.

Wolf – Black jeans/leggings, a plain grey top and gold waist coat. Fur cuffs and collar (wolf like).

Fairy G – Traditional fairy costume, complete with wand and wings. Ballet style pumps.

FIT– Traditional fairy costume, complete with wand and wings. Sash that says FIT (Fairy In Training) Ballet style pumps.

Snow White— Plain light-blue t-shirt with a simple yellow skirt. Red bow in hair. Red shoes. Basket with handle to carry.

Jean - Mid-calf-length dress (hooped or with full petticoats if possible), yellow apron, stripy tights and mop cap embellished with cleaning/cooking-themed features.

Rub and Dub – yellow tops and leggings/shorts, with pink or blue aprons and yellow caps with different-coloured bands. Small feather duster and colander big enough to wear on head.

HRH – Camouflage or green trousers and beret, with an artist's smock-type top with paint splatters on it.

Spot – A dog costume including a camouflage/green bandana, a dog tail and ears.

Courtier and attendants –Black jeans/leggings and a plain purple t-shirt. Dark denim/leather jacket and shades.

Tree – Brown leggings, brown or green top with leaves attached and a cap or hat with leaves attached or traditional tree costume.

Bunny – Grey top and trousers, fluffy tail and a headband with ears.

Dabbit and Splodge – Boiler suits covered with paint.

Dash – Cub Scout-type outfits of grey shorts, green sweatshirts, green caps and yellow neckerchiefs with a red cape.

Bolt and Whizzo— Cub Scout-type outfits of grey shorts, green sweatshirts, green caps and yellow neckerchiefs.

Mirror – Silver metallic top and silver leggings/trousers. Must be the same as the other mirrors. Please coordinate with each other.

Woodcutter – Black or grey trousers and a lumberjack shirt. Large pretend axe.

The Dream Team – Colourful dungarees and T-shirts, hard hats and trainers plus a cloth or feather duster. Please add the following accessories:

Gaffer – High-Vis vest.

Digger – Tool belt.

Cookie – Apron and carriable picnic hamper with a large pretend cookie inside.

Burley – Wrist sweatbands and inflatable weights. Two pretend 'picks'

Speedy – Sports socks long enough to wear over bottom of trousers.

Clerky – Calculator top and some rolled up A1 paper 'charts'.

Picky – Blazer and small drawstring bag with rocks in.

Bodgit, Dodgit and Scat – black jeans/trousers, a white shirt and a black blazer and sunglasses. A wad of pretend cash each.

Cleanie Jeanie Dancers – Normal costume as listed above with an additional item listed here: Washing up gloves, chef hat, cooking apron or tea towel belt.

We ask that you **Google your character** for further inspiration for costumes. On the final page are some pictures for ideas. If you are at all unsure, please do not hesitate to contact Mrs Paphitis who will check any pictures you send or show her. If you are struggling to acquire an appropriate costume, please do get in touch with Mrs Paphitis and she will see if the school has anything suitable to be borrowed.
