To find out how the shapes of solid objects made from some materials can be changed by squashing, bending, twisting and stretching. Skills: Through their learning pupils will develop the skills of: Observe closely, perform simple tests, identify and classify, use observations and ideas to suggest answers to questions and gather and record data to help in answering questions. Skills: Through their learning pupils will develop the skills of: Explore maps using simple keys; move around the map using compass points; identify the UK and its countries and capital cities on a map; find out why castles were built on hills and become familiar with these geographical features: hill, sea, river, cliff.
