Topic/s: Place Value, Addition and Subtraction, Shape and Money Aim/s:  To recognise, order and compare numbers to 100. To add and subtract two-digit numbers when crossing tens. To explore a range of poems and create their own poem.  Skills: Through their learning pupils will develop the skills of: Writing a range of text types; developing vocabulary; understanding of texts.	Topic/s: Uses of everyday materials and squash, bend, twist and stretch. Linked to our 'Castles' topic in History and Geography.  Aim/s:  To identify and compare suitability of a variety of everyday materials, including wood, metal, plastic, glass, rock, brick, paper and cardboard for particular uses.  To find out how the shapes of solid objects made from some materials can be changed by squashing, bending, twisting and stretching.  Skills: Through their learning pupils will develop the skills of: Observe closely, perform simple tests, identify and classify, use observations and ideas to suggest answers to questions and gather and record data to help in answering questions. Skills: Through their learning pupils will develop the skills of: Explore maps using simple keys; move around the map using compass points; identify the UK and its countries and capital cities on a map; find out why castles were built on hills and become familiar with these geographical features: hill, sea, river, cliff.
