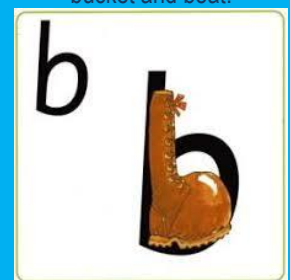
Shape and Space:
