Listen to audio books online or from the library.

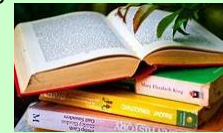
Turn on the subtitles when your child is watching television.

Count steps, trees, plants and anything you can see. Practise counting to and beyond 100.

Practise counting in 2s, 3s, 4s, 5s, and 10s.

Practise all the sums that add up to 10 and 20 e.g. 2 + 8, 11 + 9.
