

Ideas for children moving into Junior 4

Practise telling the time.



Try to estimate how long it takes you to do something. How long does the journey take? What time might the film end? How long will it take me to read the book?

Try to learn one new multiplication table over the holidays.



Challenge: Do you know it as a division?
20 ÷ 4 = 5

Practise weighing items in the kitchen.
Start looking at the weight of containers in your cupboards.



Challenge: Can you estimate the weight and see how close you are?

Take a photo to celebrate the awe and wonder of the world – it could be an amazing sunset, a view from a mountain or a rainbow.



Extra Challenge: Write a famous quote or think of your own quote to celebrate the beauty of the world.

Prepare a shoebox with items which will tell people about your interests and personality.

Bring your shoebox to school on the first day back (or during the first week) and be prepared to sit at the front of the class and tell people why your objects are important to you.
